<b>SELF DESIGN ALTERNATIVE CONCNETRATIONS (33)</b>		
Students choosing the self-designed degree option in Integrated Studies are required to complete at least 18 hours of work in a primary concentration (15 of those hours must be upper division) and at least 15 hours of course work <b>at any level</b> in a secondary concentration or concentrations. Each concentration -- and each course within each concentration -- must be linked to an overall theme and a rationale that shows how the courses will work together as a unit of study. In addition students must take an overall minimum of 42 hours of upper-division coursework to graduate. Students may not apply to the self-designed program until they have at least 60 hours of college course credits. The course list and rationale will be created in HSS 389 and is subject to approval from the Integrated Studies program. At least 30 hours of coursework must be taken in residency at Northern New Mexico College.
