Catalog Course Description	You will study twelve core functions and global criteria of the alcohol and other substance abuse, including screening, intake, orientation, assessment, crisis intervention, treatment planning, counseling, case management, client education, referral, report and record keeping, and consultation with other professionals in regard to client treatment and services. Attention will be given to the ethical considerations involved in the therapeutic process. In this course you will devote six clock hours to ethics of the substance abuse counselor. Identify and explain the use of various treatment approaches employed with drug and alcohol abusers that will result in successful outcomes. 2. Interview and then prepare a short written report on a person in recovery identifying the salient factors that ensure a successful recovery for a drug/alcohol abuser.
