Catalog Course Description	In this course students will develop reading and writing skills that will help with the writing required in their fields of study and other personal and professional contexts. They will learn to analyze the rhetorical context of any writing task and compose with purpose, audience, and genre in mind. Students will reflect on their own writing processes, learn to workshop drafts with other writers, and practice techniques for writing, revising, and editing. Prerequisite: ENG 109N, or adequate score on Course Placement Evaluation. (3, 3T+0S)
