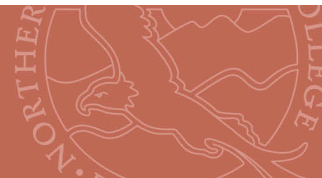

Catalog Course Description	This course provides an integrative, family-centered approach to the care of mothers and newborns. Emphasis is placed on normal and high-risk pregnancies, normal growth and development, family dynamics and the promotion of healthy behaviors in patients.

Develop and provide health and safety related education to patients and their families while recognizing the nurse's role as educator and change agent. 10. Use organizational, priority setting, and decision making skills when providing care to childbearing women and newborns in selected settings. 11. Recognize the nurse's role in reporting patient safety and quality care concerns and in supporting activities that promote performance improvement. 12. Provide care to childbearing women, newborns and families while adhering to ethical and legal standards and maintaining accountability and responsibility for care provided.
